# What is Value?

- Value is how light or dark an object is (or appears to be)
- Value makes objects appear 3-D when they are truly 2-D (flat)



# Creating Value - Stippling

- Small dots close together to form dark value and further in distance to create light value
- Methodical not random points



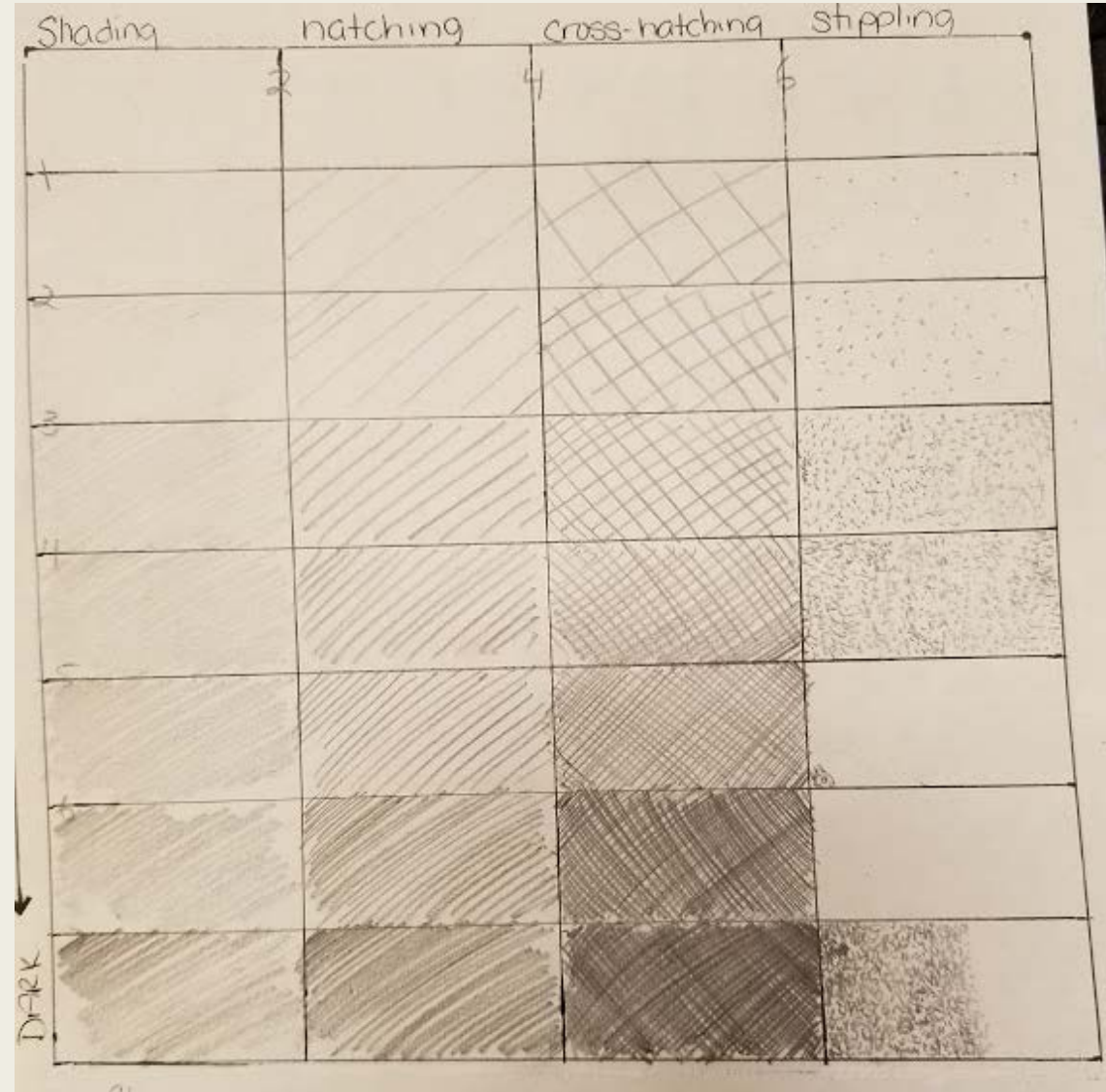

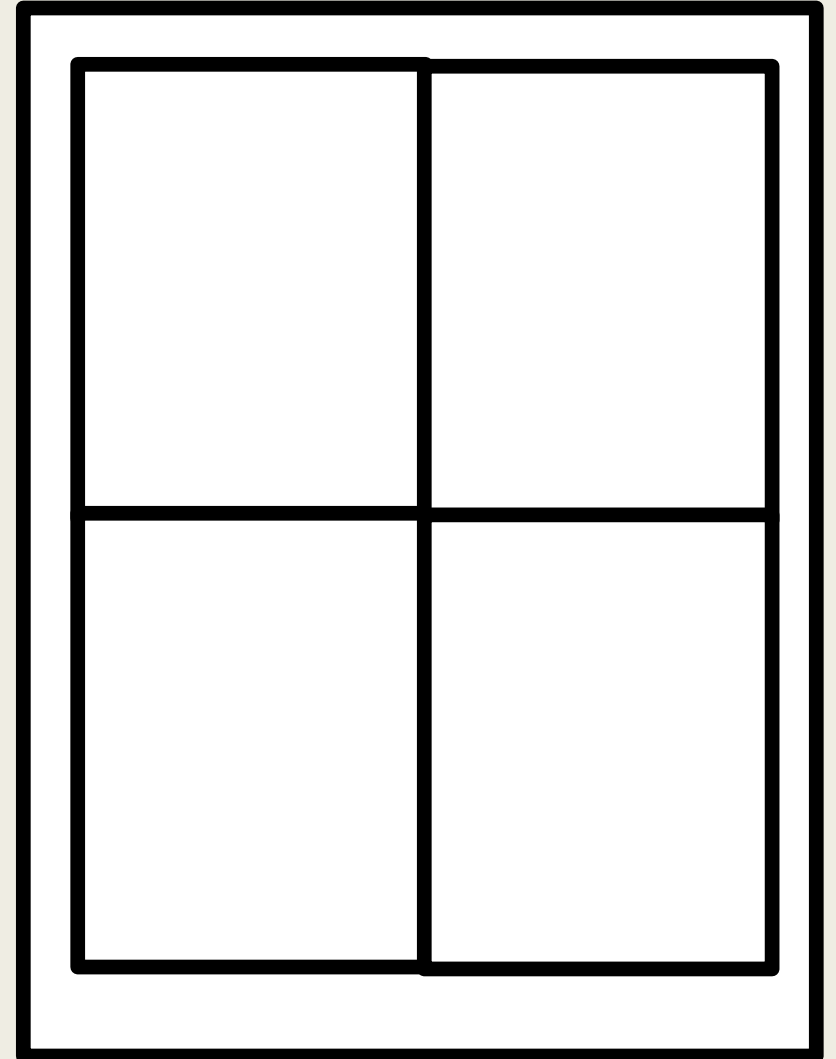


# Value Scale Practice Drawing

# Repeat for all 4 Quadrants

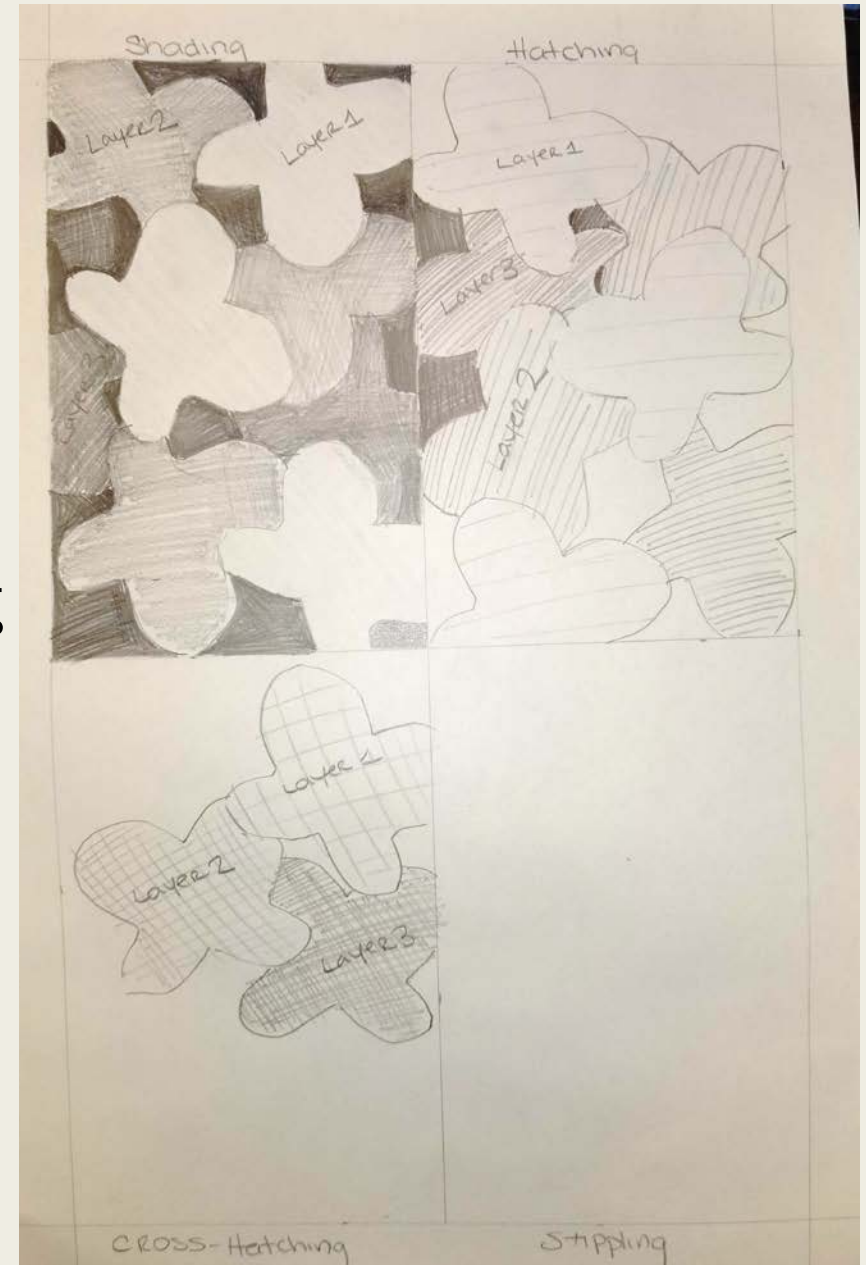
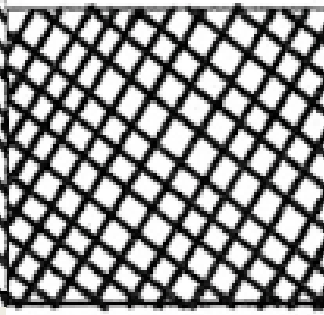
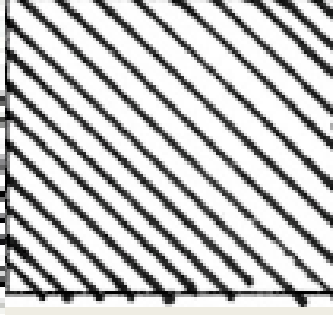
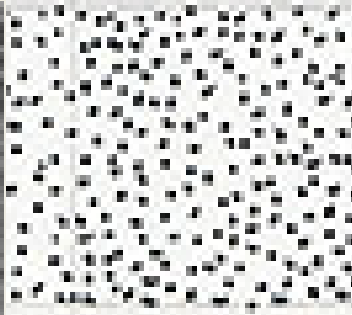
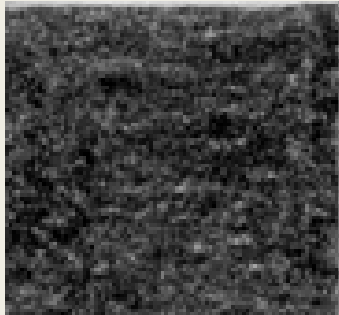
